

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY

The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemoration Committee

Each year the MLK Commemoration Committee awards multiple scholarships of at least \$1000 based on academic achievement, extra-curricular activities, and civic engagement to members of our community continuing their education. We do this through the generous support of our sponsors and a free-will offering at our annual MLK service.

Originally designated for graduating high school seniors and current college students, the scholarship opportunities have been extended to other community members seeking higher education or skills training as funding permits. This includes graduates of the Carlisle GED program and those recently released from prison, in addition to adults in graduate and post-grad studies.

Applicants should demonstrate adherence to the principles that guided the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., such as an unwavering commitment to non-violence and to policies that eliminate racial inequities and advance racial justice.

To apply, please complete the application form which follows, and gather these supporting documents:

- 1. A TRANSCRIPT (This may be an unofficial copy)
- 2. LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATATION from any two of the following: community leader, employer, mentor, coach, counselor, teacher, religious leader, relative, or friend
- 3. AN ORIGINAL ESSAY that explores the life and work of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Essays should demonstrate a thorough understanding of at least one facet of Dr. King's work (e.g. a speech, a sermon, an event, a philosophy) and discuss how Dr. King's work might be applied to improve your own community (however you define this). The length of the essay should be determined by its purpose. In other words, the essay should be long enough to handle the chosen topic thoroughly and meaningfully without including unnecessary material. Essays should be typed and polished.

Note: Carlisle High School students can also obtain an application in the McGowan counseling center or from their English teacher.

The deadline to apply for scholarships for the 2023-2024 academic year is June 1, 2023.

Funds will begin to be disbursed to the schools of the successful applicants within a few months. The scholarship awardees for the 2023-2024 academic year will be recognized at the MLK Commemoration Event in January 2024.
