Seven elementary schools, grades K – 5 Two middle schools, grades 6 – 8 One high school, grades 9 - 12

Each of the models we are currently considering would include closing at least one of our elementary schools, and all but one model includes building a new, larger school.

The models we will consider for the future, to better fit our changing population:



MODEL 1 - "ister Schools"

Reconfigure our visting tementary schools so that two of them, become schools for grades K - 1, two become grades 2 - 3, and two become grades 4 - 5. Nose one existing elementary.



MODEL 2 Build a new Kind (rgarten Center for all students to attend, Astrict-wide. Convert existing ele prataries to grades 1 – 5. Close one existing clen antary school.



MODEL 3 Build a new Kindergarten Center for all students to a tende astrictwide. Convert existing elementaries to grades 1 – 5. Close two existing tementary schools.



MODEL 4- "S. gle Upper Flementary School" Build a new school for grades 4 & 5, and convert existing dementaries to grades K – 3. Close two existing elementary schools.



MODEL 5- "Two Upper Elementary 4-5 Schools" Build a new school for grades 4 & 5. Convert one elementary to a 4 & 5 building, and convert existing elementaries to grades K – 3. Close two existing elementary schools.



MODEL 6- "New 7-8 Intermediate School" Build a new school for grades 7 & 8. Convert middle schools to grades 4 – 6, and convert existing elementaries to grades K –3. Close two existing elementary schools.



MODEL 7 Build a new school for grades 7 & 8, and add a 9th Grade Academy to the building. Convex middle schools to grades 4 – 6, and convert e istic g elementaries to grades K – 3. The key h school would educate grades 10 – 12. Conse two existing elementary schools.



MODEL 8- "Two Upper Elementary 5-6

<u>Schools</u>" Build a new school for grades 5 & 6. Convert one elementary to a 5 & 6 building, and convert existing elementaries to grades K-4. Convert middle schools to grades 7 & 8. Close one elementary school.

It's important to remember that no decisions have been made!

The committee will thoroughly examine all of these options before presenting a recommendation to the School Board.

Changes would not occur for several years, and transitions for students and staff would be made thoughtfully and with great care.



MODEL 9: "Two Upper Elementary 4-6

<u>Schools</u>" Build a new school for grades 4-6. Convert one elementary to a 4-6 building, and convert existing elementaries to grades K-3. Convert middle schools to grades 7 & 8. Close one or two elementary schools.
