Course Selection

CHS students in grades 9, 10, 11 and Middle School 8th Grade Students, it is important once the course selection process begins, you take the needed time to complete the necessary steps to ensure an appropriate schedule for next school year. The course selection process requires all students in grades 8, 9, 10 and 11 to pick courses which best fits their educational goals. Questions or concerns about courses, or the actually process, can be directed towards grade level principals, counselors and/or teachers.

Timeline of Important Tasks

Educational Planning Guide

- High school students will receive access to an online/electronic EPG which they will be able to view at their leisure.
- Current 8th grade students will receive a hard copy/booklet of the EPG to learn more about course selection and available courses and programs at CHS.

Teacher Recommendations

• Teachers will be making course recommendations in terms of appropriate placement for next school year. Most recommendations will be in the area of core classes and particular elective courses. Teachers will be making recommendations in PowerSchool from January 27th to February 19th.

Course Selection Presentation

- High School students will view a course selection video the week of February 15th during Bison Block.
 The video will highlight key items pertaining to course selection and also specific instructions to enter courses into PowerSchool.
- Current 8th grade students will learn about the course selection process and how to enter courses through the video and other instructions which may be provided by Middle School Counselors. The information will be made available to students during the week of **February 15th**.

Student Course Submission

• All high school students and 8th grade students will have a two-week window to enter courses into PowerSchool from **February 22nd to March 5th**. During this timeframe students will receive reminders, and additional help if needed to complete the course selection process.

Final Review

• A review of the course selection process will occur between March 8th to March 26th. It is extremely important that students have all courses selected prior to counselors beginning the review process.

Other Information

• Students and parents will have access to several video links. Students and parents will be able to view the videos at their leisure and learn more about different courses and programs at CHS. Some information may be grade level specific.




Step 2: You will see this screen with each core subject area and elective courses



Step 3: Click the edit box on the right side of each core/elective




Step 4: Choose your courses (English, Math, Science, and History). Place a checkmark in the box and press 'SUBMIT'

Note: the course your teacher has recommended for you is in BOLD




Step 5: Choose your top two electives (this year there are ten screens)

 - When you have 4, 'SUBMIT'




Step 7: Review of selected courses
